

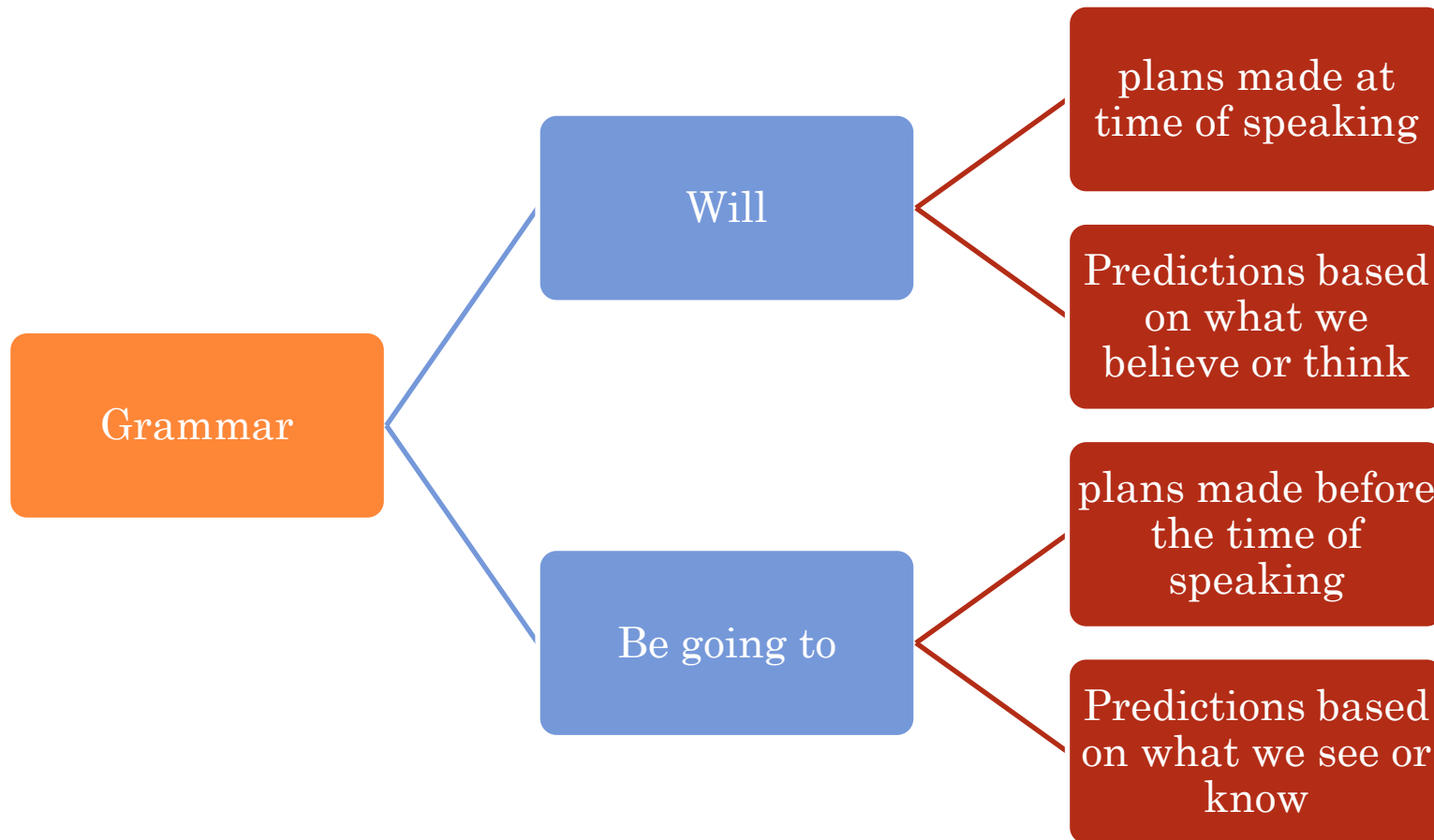

I'll buy it.

- Predictions based on what **we think or believe** about the future.

I think Brazil **will win** the match.
He believes he **will pass** the exam.

- Plans which are made **before the moment of speaking**

I have **made a reservation**. We **are going to have dinner** at the chinese restaurant nearby.



Be going to

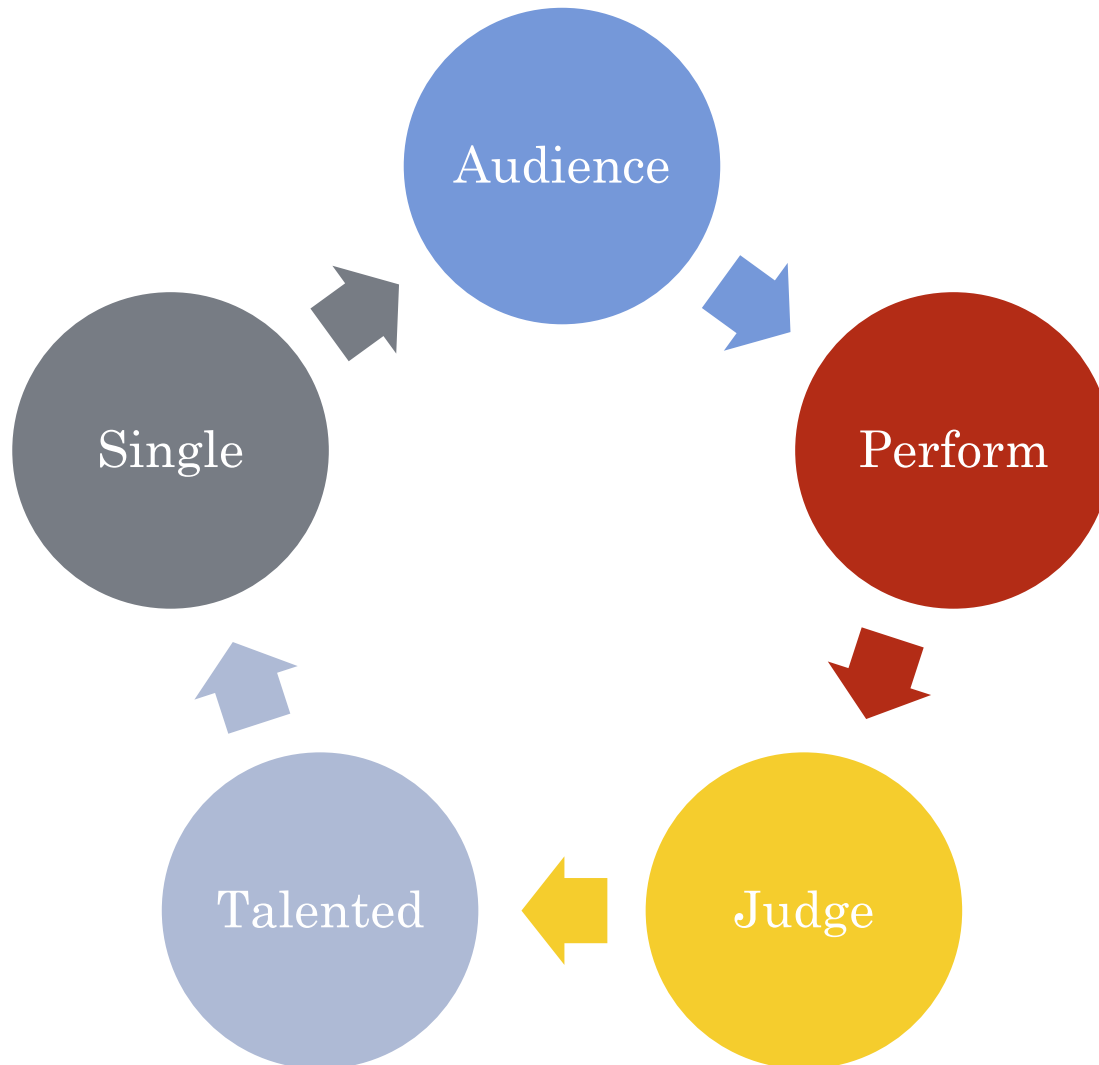
- Predictions based on what we see or know

'tæləntəd

someone who is talented is **very good at something**

Single

'sɪŋɡ(ə)l

a musical record with **only one song** or **piece of music**



1. They've just released **their new single**.
2. **The greatest single** so far.



A young **talented** singer is going to **perform** next week. Right now, in the rehearsing room, he is asking his **audiences** to **judge** his new **single** for feedback before **performing** it live on stage.
