



Active Voice with Modals



Active Voice with Modals

Structure: S + modal verb + V-bare inf + O

Example: They may build a new bridge.











We use the *passive voice* when the *agent* of the action is *not known* or *not important*.



Active: S + modal verb + V-bare inf + 0

Passive: S + modal verb + be + past participle (+ by 0)

Active: They may build a new bridge.

Passive: A new bridge may be built.





- If the **agent** is **known**, it can be indicated by a phrase beginning with **by**.

Example: A new bridge may be built by the local people.
