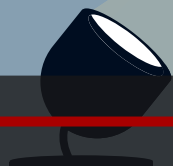

sequence (n) / 'si:kwəns/

*a series of related things
or events*

→ in sequence

E.g. The “Cinderella” has a
sequence of events leading to
the happy ending.



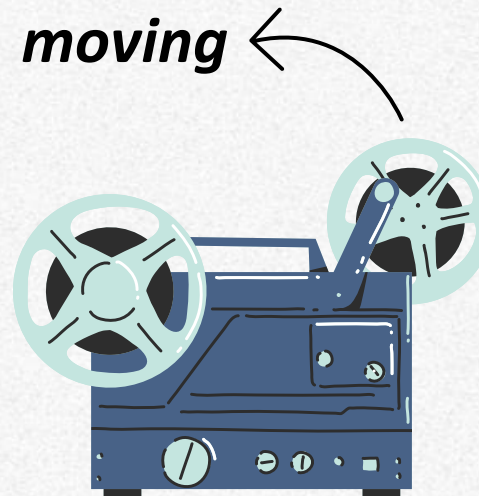
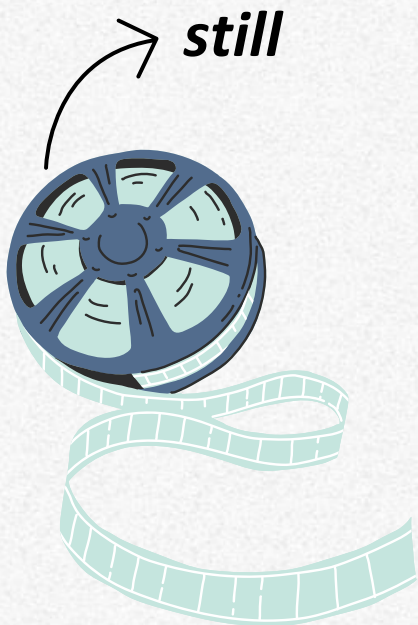
still (adj) /stɪl/

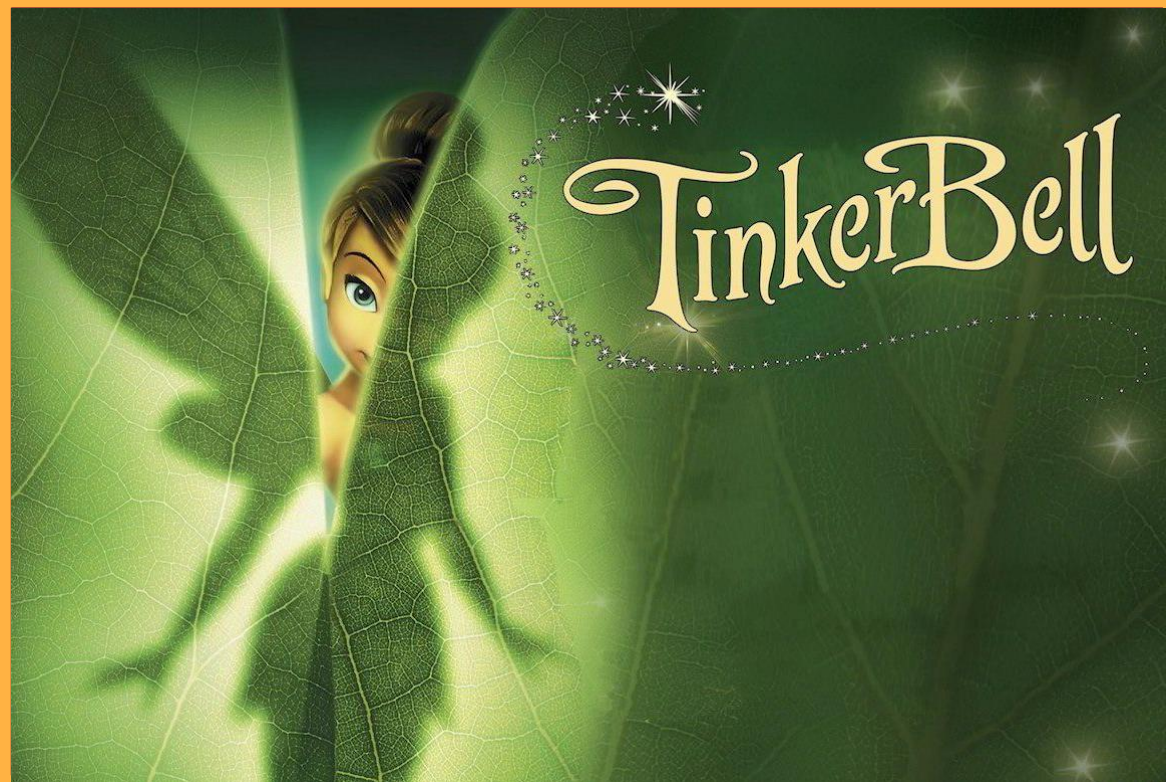
not moving, calm and quiet

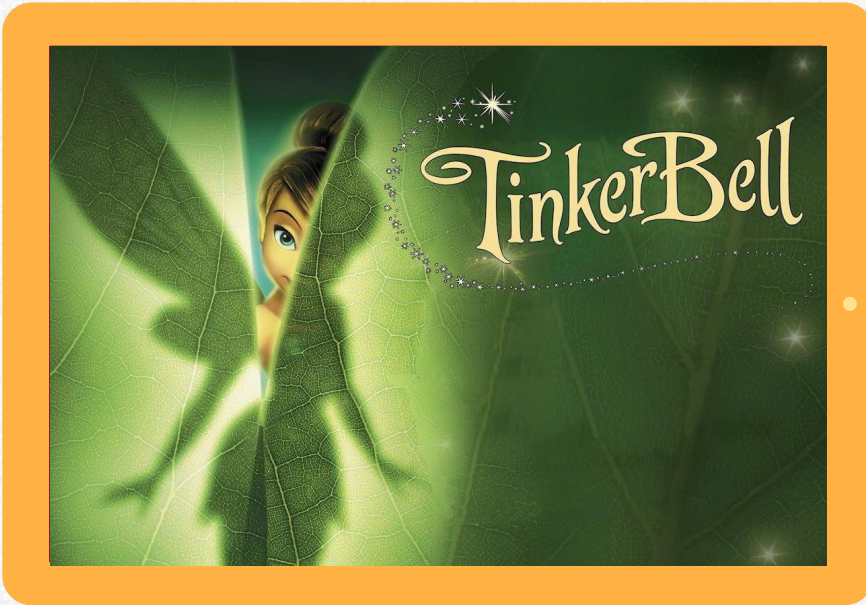
→ a still image film

→ stillness (n) ≠ motion (n)

E.g. Please keep **still** while I take you a picture.







exist (v) /ɪg 'zɪst/

to be or to be real

→ **existence (n)**

→ **cease to exist**

E.g. Tinkerbelle **exists** in
the minds of children.



replace (v) /rɪˈpleɪs/ *to do sth instead of sb or sth else*

→ replace sb/sth **with** sb/sth

→ replacement (n)

E.g. Snow White's father could not **replace** her mother with a new wife.





rapid (adj) /'ræpɪd/ *quick or sudden*

→ **rapidly (adv)** = quickly = suddenly

E.g. She left **rapidly** because she was going to be late.



spread (v) /spred/



to affect more and more places, people, or things, or to make something do this

→ **spread (n):** *act of spreading*

E.g. The information about “Avatar 2” is **spreading** on the Internet .

industry (n) /'ɪn·də·stri/ *a type of business*



E.g. It was not until 1915 that the cinema really became an **industry**.
