



Present simple vs present continuous







Present simple is used to talk about habits or things we do regularly

(+)

S + V(s/es)

Ex: My mother cooks everyday.

(-)

S + do/ does + not + V

Ex: My mother doesn't cook everyday.

(?)

Do/ Does + S + V? Ex: Does your mother cook everyday?



Present continuous is used to talk about things which are happening at the moment of speaking.

(+)

S + is/ am/ are + V-ing

Ex: My mother is

cooking now.

S + is/ am/ are + not + V-ing

Ex: My mother isn't

cooking now.



- Time expressions:
 - <u>Present simple</u>: usually, always, every day, often, never, seldom...

Ex: She usually rides the bikes to go to school.

- Present continuous: now, at the moment, at present, ...

Ex: He is studying for his exams at the moment.

• We don't usually use the present continuous tense with stative verbs (like, love, need, want, know, agree, etc.)

Ex: You know him.

Not: You are knowing him.
