# TO-INFINITIVE & BARE INFINITIVES

## To-infinitive

Some verbs are followed by to-infinitives such as decide, expect, plan, want, promise, agree, hope, hesitate, ask....

## Bare infinitive

The bare infinitive is used as the main verb after the modal auxiliary verbs 'should, can, will, etc.' , watch, hear, feel or make, have, let.
