



Yes, she is a singer. So, we can see her singing. But think about the place where she sings.

Yeah, I want to emphasize on the way we stress two words: singer and perform. What are the stresses here, everyone?


For the word "singer", can you find out the stress? Yeah, that's right it stresses on the 1st syllable.

For the word "perform", can you find out the stress? Yeah, it stresses on the 2<sup>nd</sup> syllable.

So, as you notice that these words on the left column are nouns and adjectives. So what is the stress for them? Stress on 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>nd</sup> syllable, everyone? Yeah, the stress should be on the 1<sup>st</sup> syllable.



How about those words on the right column? They are two-syllable verbs. So what is the stress for them? Stress on  $1^{st}$  or  $2^{nd}$  syllable, everyone? Yeah, the stress should be on the  $2^{nd}$  syllable.



## Audio:

Now, let's say the words on the left column with me. Your turn first. Then I "Singer - programme – common – careful" On the left column, they are nouns and adjectives.

On the right column, how do you say these words. Your turn first. Then I say "Relax – perform – attract - decide". On the right column, they are verbs.



So, there are some tips for you to place the stress correctly. First, if the two-syllable words are nouns and adjectives. We'll have the stress on the 1<sup>st</sup> syllable.

However, if we have the two-syllable words are verbs. We'll have the stress on the 2<sup>nd</sup> syllable.
