Project objectives

Ss will be able to

Write a 100-150 report in English about doing suggestions for improving the environment.

- Use the future will and the “be going to” correctly in the writing.

- Apply words about protecting the environment in the family in the writing.

HOW TO WRITE?

First, brainstorm those questions and note down the answers.

1. Do you usually protect the environment in your school?
2. How do you do it? Alone or with your friends?
3. What do you think your friends or your family should be doing to improve the environment?
4. Do you think the things you do to improve the environment really make a big difference or small difference?
5. Do people in your school usually take actions to improve the environment?

Second, let's find out the structure suggested to write the paragraph

- Topic sentence: to indicate our opinion

For ex: “There are three things we can do to improve the environment in our school.”

- Supporting sentences, you should put them in order like this, use the conjunction/ linking words :
- “First, we should...”
- “Secondly,...”
- “Thirdly,...”
- “Next,...”
- “Furthermore,..”
- “After that, we can...”

Then, you can put an example for the first suggested action to indicate your own idea “for example, we can...”

After the example, we can tell the effect of the suggested problem “by doing this/ with this action/ if we do this, we can...”

Last but not least, to sum up the whole paragraph, you should just use the phrases like

- To sum up
- To conclude
- In conclusion
- ...
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Lastly, brainstorm your own suggestions to improve the environment
